JOB TITLE: Mental Health/Addictions Counsellor

IMMEDIATE SUPERVISOR: Clinical Supervisor

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Delivery of Onen'tó:kon Treatment Services Mental Health and Addictions Program;
- Educate residents by facilitating lectures, videos about chemical dependencies and the effects on their lives and others around them;
- Provide one on one counselling session;
- Facilitate group therapy sessions and work;
- Hold case conference;
- Provide crisis intervention;
- Debrief with colleagues on a daily basis;
- Network with other agencies in order to assist in pre and post treatment;
- Assist families of clients, when possible, by providing information and assistance on Mental Health issues
- Support clients in a caring and empathetic manner which provides a favorable atmosphere for the client;
- Provide on-call services which includes the Counsellor on call 24/7, will escort, and provide support to clients and staff in any way possible, as per on-call schedule;
- Maintain clinical files and reports, attend weekly Clinical meetings;
- Help clients explore and identify problem areas in their lives and set realistic goals;
- To network with other organizations for the benefit of clients and ensure that proper referrals are done when necessary;
- Collects and maintain statistics on clients;
- Case load of maximum of four clients.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- The incumbent must have Addiction Counselling skills and have experience in dealing with trauma & mental health issues;
- The incumbent must have a "Counsellor Certification" (eg: CCAC – Certified Canadian Addiction Counsellor / CIAS – Certified Indigenous Addictions Specialist / ICADC – International Certified Alcohol & Drug Counsellor);

- Experience working in the addictions field and Counselling with a case load in a residential setting;
- Competency in dealing with trauma & mental health issues;
- Ability to identify culturally relevant practices and refer client(s) to Cultural Team;
- Effective communication skills, both written and verbal, in English, Mohawk an asset;
- To have a genuine interest in people and be motivators of change;
- Ability to work in a team setting;
- Willingness to learn and grow as a person;
- Ability to work in a team setting or autonomously;
- A valid driver's license with a clear driving abstract and must be willing to acquire a Class 4B or more.

ASSETS:

- Ability to speak one's indigenous language, preferably Kanien'kehá:ka (Mohawk).
- Knowledge of Microsoft Office/Teams/Zoom applications is an asset.
- A valid First Aid and/or CPR course or the willingness to acquire. Can be provided by Onen'tó:kon Healing Lodge.
- Maintained a healthy lifestyle for at least the past two years.
