## OUR SPACE

The FPIC team will temporarily settle in your community with the technological equipment, instructors and materials necessary to manufacture your projects. Our facilities provide you with a safe place to turn your creative ideas into reality using digital manufacturing technologies.

Our team of young Indigenous instructors provide workshops to develop projects that address a problem, have purpose, are culturally significant or are just fun to do.

Whether it's a pair of moccasin, a custom t-shirt or a remote control drone, you'll learn how the digital milling machine works, vinyl cutting, digital embroidery machine, laser cutting, Arduino programming and the 3D printer works.

## WHAT IS A FABLAB?

A FabLab, or digital fabrication laboratory, is a place to play, create, mentor, invent, and a place for learning and innovation. FabLabs provide access to the environment, skills, materials, and technologies to allow anyone to make almost anything (<https://www.fablabs.io/>).

## WHO WE ARE

The FPIC set up the first Indigenous FabLab in Canada. The nomad FabLab aims not to leave behind young Indigenous people living in often isolated communities. With its nomad FabLab, FPIC offers young Indigenous rigorous training that leads to employment.
