Program Description:

The objective of this Attestation of Collegial Studies of 420 hours (intensive) in Radio is to enable graduates of the program to become a journalist and/or a radio host in the context of radio communication intended for to a diverse audience.

The program aims to train individuals to perform the work duties of:

- 1- A Radio Host and Production Technician.
- 2- A Journalist.

Block 1 enables students to develop their skills in information researching, in communication with the public and news coverage. Block 2 covers interviewing and sound production techniques (podcasts), and Block 3 covers reporting, news production and radio hosting.

- Five (5) years experience in the discipline
- Good knowledge of the First Nations community for being part of or for previously having worked with
- Excellent oral and written English
